Understanding the requirements, accountabilities and responsibilities for Civil and Defence Part-145 and Part-M regulations

EASA Part-145 and Part-M are the European standards which define continuing airworthiness maintenance and maintenance management requirements for EU based service providers. MRPs Part-M and Part-145 are the UK Defence equivalent regulations. When there is a need to satisfy both regulatory frameworks there are many similarities and differences to be aware of.

Civil and Defence regulations are constantly evolving, therefore being competent in interpreting the purpose, intent and differences between Civil and Defence regulations is essential for enabling an effective and streamlined compliance process. Regulatory compliance can become a costly burden and raise safety risk if the intent and requirements are not fully understood.
